possession and spirit mediumship in North and Sub-Saharan Africa and in some Afro-American communities in the Western Hemisphere. The sources on Western Afro-American communities were chosen to shed light on the African continent and the Americas. The bibliography, while not exhaustive, provides extensive research on the area of research in spiritualism in Africa and Afro-America. The bibliography also provides unique sources on spirit cults, ritual or ethnic groups and will be of especial interest to researchers. Although published in the late 70s, this book will still provide an incredibly useful research tool for academics in the area of religion, with a focus on spiritualism and non-western religions.

The roots of Hallowe'en lie in the ancient pre-Christian Celtic festival of Samhain, a feast to mark the death of the old year and the birth of the new. It was believed that on this night the veil separating the worlds of the living and the dead grew thin and ruptured, allowing spirits to pass

through and walk unseen but not unheard amongst men. The advent of Christianity saw the pagan festival subsumed in All Souls' Day, when across Europe the dead were mourned and venerated. Children and the poor, often masked or in outlandish costume, wandered the night begging 'soul cakes' in exchange for prayers, and fires burned to keep malevolent phantoms at bay. From Europe, the haunted tradition would quickly take root and flourish in the fertile soil of the New World. Feeding hungrily on fresh lore, consuming half-remembered tales of its own shadowy origins and rituals, Hallowe'en was reborn in America. The pumpkin supplanted the carved turnip; costumes grew ever stranger, and celebrants both rural and urban seized gleefully on the festival's intoxicating, lawless spirit. For one wild night, the dead stared into the faces of the living and the living, ghoulishly masked and clad in tattered backwoods baroque, stared back. The photographs in *Haunted Air* provide an extraordinary glimpse into the traditions of this macabre festival from ages past, and form an

Hoarding is unique among the disorders included in the American Psychiatric Association's DSM-5, because its diagnosis requires the existence of a material entity: the hoard. *Possessed* therefore considers the hoard as an aesthetic object produced by clashing perspectives about the meaning or value of objects. The 2000s have seen a surge of cultural interest in hoarding and those whose possessions overwhelm their living spaces. Unlike traditional economic elaborations of hoarding, which focus on stockpiles of bullion or grain,

contemporary hoarding results in accumulations of objects that have little or no value or utility. For these photo-painting essays I chose dolls, clowns, cats, and a rubber ducky. These are toys that I loved as a child and still fascinate me today. And I think, if pressed, I would find it hard to part with them. As an artist, I believe animism is possible. I believe that the universe is as yet uncharted and the possibilities of life are endless. Humans, for instance, live in the light and fear darkness. But it's possible there are other intelligent forms of life. And that some of these live in darkness. Children sense things differently. Perhaps, the possibilities of life are greater to them than for adults. And why not? I believe that energy can be inside things. And toys, for some reason, hold a unique interest to these energies. Could it be because they are uniquely attractive to

children and hold their attention? What would happen if your favorite toy suddenly and unexpectedly began to change? What if it began to move? What if it moved its head, hand, or opened its eyes? What if it began to come to life? What if it became possessed? The thought of this possibility has most likely crossed everyone's mind. And these questions are the queries of this art series. This is a serious photo-painting essay art series. It's aim is to take the viewer in a journey into the mind. In this journey, it explores concepts of mind, memory, perception, and emotions. It also explores the unimaginable but wholly explainable concept of predatory behaviors by intelligent beings of other dimensions on human beings. In the end, I believe that we are never alone. Energy abounds around us. I believe that these photo-paintings came out of my deep unconscious. Because of this, in a way, this process of art is cathartic in nature. I hope you will experience something from looking at these. At the least, you might remember a toy or an experience you had in childhood.

The author is a medical psychologist who has had unusual opportunities for studying German mentality. He characterizes the condition of Germany as one of dæmonic possession and Hitler as the primitive medicine-man who gained a magical ascendancy by playing the role of medium to the German unconscious. He analyses the fundamental instability of the collective German psychology and relates this to the dæmonic outbreak. Hitler is discussed as personality, as symbol, and as a disease. The influence of the Wagnerian German myth upon Hitler's inflammable imagination is discussed and the basic ideas of Hitlerism are traced to their source. This is the attempt of psychology to elucidate the irrational and unintelligible elements in the present chaos."

For the last twenty-four years the 34 year-old photographer Helge Tscharn has contributed regularly to skateboard and music magazines. Tscharn himself is a European-ranked skater, and his knowledge of the sport allows him to take particularly dramatic and impressive photographs of such skating celebrities as Tony Hawk and Mike McGill performing breathtaking stunts. Beginning in the early 1990's, Tscharn brought the dynamism of his skate-boarding

Possessors and Possessed analyzes how and why museums—characteristically Western institutions—emerged in the late-nineteenth-century Ottoman Empire. Shaw argues that, rather than directly emulating post-Enlightenment museums of Western Europe, Ottoman elites produced categories of collection and modes of display appropriate to framing a new identity for the empire in the modern

era. In contrast to late-nineteenth-century Euro-American museums, which utilized organizational schema based on positivist notions of progress to organize exhibits of fine arts, Ottoman museums featured military spoils and antiquities long before they turned to the "Islamic" collections with which they might have been more readily associated. The development of these various modes of collection reflected shifting moments in Ottoman identity production. Shaw shows how Ottoman museums were able to use collection and exhibition as devices with which to weave counter-colonial narratives of identity for the Ottoman Empire. Impressive for both the scope and the depth of its research, *Possessors and Possessed* lays the groundwork for future inquiries into the development of museums outside of the Euro-American milieu.
