The stories and sketches collected in *The Buried Life* offer an intimate perspective of people responding to challenges they encounter in dealing with the conditions of their lives. These vignettes revolving around a variety of story lines introduce a wide range of characters, some are set against the background of events during the 1940s and 1950s depicted in *A Stirring of the Air*, *A Shifting of the Light*.
