Blending dark humor and pathos, *Scarred Hearts* was hailed as a masterpiece on publication in Romanian in 1939, and was more recently compared to Thomas Mann's *Magic Mountain* and the fiction of Franz Kafka. Like Emmanuel, Max Blecher suffered from tuberculosis of the spine, and spent the last year of his life in a full body cast and wheelchair, before dying at age twenty-nine with two novels completed.
