This volume investigates how urban growth and prosperity transformed the cities of the Roman Mediterranean in the last centuries BCE and the first centuries CE, integrating debates about Roman urban space with discourse on Roman urban history. The contributions explore how these cities developed landscapes full of civic memory and ritual, saw commercial priorities transforming the urban environment, and began to expand significantly beyond their wall circuits. These interrelated developments not only changed how cities looked and could be experienced, but they also affected the functioning of the urban community and together contributed to keeping increasingly complex urban communities socially cohesive. By focusing on the transformation of urban landscapes in the Late Republican and Imperial periods, the volume adds a new, explicitly historical

angle to current debates about urban space in Roman studies. Confronting archaeological and historical approaches, the volume presents developments in Italy, Africa, Greece, and Asia Minor, thus significantly broadening the geographical scope of the discussion and offering novel theoretical perspectives alongside well-documented, thematic case studies. *Urban Space and Urban History in the Roman World* will be of interest to anyone working on Roman urbanism or Roman history in the Late Republic and early Empire.

evolutionary dental morphology, microwear and mesowear, ecomorphology, mammal community structure analysis), contextual paleoenvironmental studies (paleosols and sedimentology, ichnofossils, pollen, phytoliths, plant macrofossils), and special techniques (bone microstructure, biomineral isotopes, inorganic isotopes, 3-D morphometrics, and ecometric modeling). A final chapter discusses how to integrate results of these studies with taphonomic data in order to more accurately characterize an ancient ecosystem.  Beginning in the twelfth century, clergy and laity alike started wondering with intensity about the historical and developmental details of Jesus' early life. Was the Christ Child like other

children, whose characteristics and capabilities depended on their age? Was he sweet and tender, or formidable and powerful? Not finding sufficient information in the Gospels, which are almost completely silent about Jesus' childhood, medieval Christians turned to centuries-old apocryphal texts for answers. In *The Quest for the Christ Child in the Later Middle Ages*, Mary Dzon demonstrates how these apocryphal legends fostered a vibrant and creative medieval piety. Popular tales about the Christ Child entertained the laity and at the same time were reviled by some members of the intellectual elite of the church. In either case, such legends, so persistent, left their mark on theological, devotional, and literary texts. The Cistercian abbot Aelred of Rievaulx urged his monastic readers to imitate the Christ Child's development through spiritual growth; Francis of Assisi encouraged his followers to emulate the Christ Child's poverty and rusticity; Thomas Aquinas, for his part, believed that apocryphal stories about the Christ Child would encourage youths to be presumptuous, while

Birgitta of Sweden provided pious alternatives in her many Marian revelations. Through close readings of such writings, Dzon explores the continued transmission and appeal of apocryphal legends throughout the Middle Ages and demonstrates the significant impact that the Christ Child had in shaping the medieval religious imagination.

Fjords are deep, glacially carved estuaries that are peculiar to certain coastlines, and have several characteristics that distinguish them from shallower embayments. At higher latitudes they indent the western coastlines of Scandinavia, North and South America, and New Zealand. They are also a common feature of much of the arctic coastline. The papers contained in this volume were presented at a workshop funded by the NATO Advanced Studies Institute in Victoria, British Columbia. It may seem curious to the reader that this special class of estuaries should have attracted an international gathering of oceanographers from several different disciplines. The reason for this interest stems from both practical and scientific considerations. On the one hand, fjords are a feature common to the coastlines of several

countries that depend heavily on the oceans for communication, fisheries and other resources. The impact of man's activities on these coasts has created a demand for new knowledge of the physical, biological and chemical aspects of fjords. Sometimes man's influence on the ocean is intentional as, for example, in the artificial control of ice cover; often it is the more insidious build-up of toxic wastes that is of concern. These problems are particularly acute where the conflicting demands of fisheries, industrial development and recreation meet in a single fjord; and indeed, this is a common occurrence along several of the fjords in Scandinavia and Canada.
