Mozart's Piano Sonata No. 16 in C major, K 545 was written in 1788 and is sometimes known by the title, 'Sonata Facile' or 'Sonata Semplice'. Since its publication in 1805 - 14 years after the composer's death - it has become perhaps the most popular and best-loved of the Mozart piano sonatas. K 545 is in three movements - the well-known Allegro, an Andante and a lively Rondo Allegretto. The Sonata No. 1 in C major, K 279 was written in 1774 when the composer was just 18 years old, and is the first of the 18 Mozart piano sonatas. K 279 is in three movements - an Allegro, a lyrical Andante and a brilliant Allegro finale.

As Swafford reveals, it's nearly impossible to understand classical music's origins and indeed its evolutions, as well as the Baroque period, without studying the man himself.

Mozart's piano sonatas are among the most familiar of his works and stand alongside those of Haydn and Beethoven as staples of the pianist's repertoire. In this study, John Irving looks at a wide selection of contextual situations for Mozart's sonatas, focusing on the variety of ways in which they assume identities and achieve meanings. In particular, the book seeks to establish the

provisionality of the sonatas' notated texts, suggesting that the texts are not so much identifiers as possibilities and that their identity resides in the usage. Close attention is paid to reception matters, analytical approaches, organology, the role of autograph manuscripts, early editions and editors, and aspects of historical performance practice - all of which go beyond the texts in opening windows onto Mozart's sonatas. Treating the sonatas collectively as a repertoire, rather than as individual works, the book surveys broad thematic issues such as the role of historical writing about music in defining a generic space for Mozart's sonatas, their construction within pedagogical traditions, the significance of sound as opposed to sight in these works (and in particular their sound on fortepianos of the later eighteenth-century), and the creative role of the performer in their representation beyond the frame of the text. Drawing together and synthesizing this wealth of material, Irving provides an invaluable reference source for those already familiar with this repertoire.
