Diese Arbeit gewann 2007 den Preis der Theologischen Fakultät der Universität Basel. Was bedeutet Zions Weiblichkeit in der jüdischen Religions- und Literaturgeschichte? Die biblische Zionsgestalt ist schon im Midrasch des Hohenliedes die Geliebte, an der sich Gott freut, sie ist aber auch die verlassene Mutter, die Stadt Jerusalem, wie im biblischen Klagelied. Die hebräische synagogale Poesie widerspiegelt seit Jannai (6. Jh.) und über Abraham Ibn Ezra (11./12. Jh.) hinaus in der weiblichen Zionsgestalt das wechselnde Selbstverständnis des jüdischen Volkes. Der literarischen Palette von Frauenmetaphern Zions

widmet sich nun erstmalig diese motivgeschichtliche Untersuchung. Der neue Ansatz der Autorin zeigt, wie die jüdischen Hofpoeten, u.a. Shlomo Ibn Gabirol, Moshe Ibn Ezra und Jehuda Halevi das traditionelle Frauenbild Zions mit der Figur der schönen Geliebten aus der arabo-hebräischen Liebesdichtung verbinden, ihr aber auch die männliche Rolle des sehnsüchtigen Freundes / Schützlings aus der Panegyrik geben. Welche Funktion hat diese kontroverse Doppelrolle Zions? Die Problemstellung ist das Exil: Irrt Zion, die Geliebte Gottes, ziellos umher oder sucht sie nach Gott und ihrer Heimat? Die Autorin bietet nicht nur ein literarisches Panorama hebräischer Poesie, sondern rückt die bedeutendste Literaturgattung des Mittelalters in ein neues Licht. Die beigelegte CD-ROM enthält 145 übersetzte und kommentierte Gedichte klassischer Piyyutdichter des Landes Israel und der Dichter des Goldenen Zeitalters von al-Andalus. Davon werden

Many early novels were cosmopolitan books, read from London to Leipzig and beyond, available in nearly simultaneous translations into French, English, German, and other European languages. In *Novel Translations*, Bethany Wiggin charts just one of the paths by which newness—in its avatars as fashion, novelties, and the novel—entered the European world in the decades around 1700. As readers across Europe snapped up novels, they domesticated the genre. Across borders, the novel lent readers everywhere a suggestion of sophistication, a familiarity with circumstances beyond their local ken. Into the eighteenth century, the modern German novel was not German at all; rather, it was French, as suggested by Germans' usage of the French word *Roman* to describe a wide variety of genres: pastoral romances, war and travel chronicles, heroic narratives, and courtly fictions. Carried in large part on the coattails of the Huguenot diaspora, these romans, nouvelles, amours secrets, histoires galantes, and histories scandaleuses shaped German literary culture to a previously unrecognized extent. Wiggin contends that this French chapter in the German novel's history began to draw to a close only in the 1720s, more than sixty years after the word first migrated into German. Only gradually did the *Roman* go native; it remained laden with the baggage from its "French" origins even into the nineteenth century.

In *Enlightenment Underground*, Mulsow shows that even in the late seventeenth century some thinkers in Germany ventured to express extremely

dangerous ideas, but did so as part of a secret underground. Scouring manuscript collections across northern Europe, Mulsow studied the writings of countless hitherto unknown radical jurists, theologians, historians, and dissident students who pushed for the secularization of legal, political, social, and religious knowledge. Often their works circulated in manuscript, anonymously, or as clandestinely published books. Working as a philosophical microhistorian, Mulsow has discovered the identities of several covert radicals and linked them to circles of young German scholars, many of whom were connected with the vibrant radical cultures of the Netherlands, England, and Denmark. The author reveals how radical ideas and contributions to intellectual doubt came from Socinians and Jews, church historians and biblical scholars, political theorists, and unemployed university students. He shows that misreadings of humorous or ironic works sometimes gave rise to unintended skeptical thoughts or corrosively political interpretations of Christianity. This landmark book overturns stereotypical views of the early Enlightenment in Germany as cautious, conservative, and moderate, and replaces them with a new portrait that reveals a movement far more radical, unintended, and puzzling than previously suspected.

This monograph is a study of the perceptions reflected in the Book of Haggai regarding the primary social, political and religious institutions in early Persian Yehud. Special attention is given to the form and function of prophecy, and to the role of the prophet in society. The study includes a history of the criticism of Haggai, a study of the book's redactional history and socio-political context, and an exegesis and literary analysis of the text. It concludes with an examination of the distinctive perspectives found in the book and the sociological and religious milieu that produced them. The work is particularly useful for its detailed analysis of the biblical text, its attention to recent literature on the early Persian period, and its multidisciplinary and integrative approach.

The Enlightenment was based on the use of reason, common sense, and "natural law," and was paralleled by an emphasis on feelings and the emotions in religious, especially Pietist circles.

Progressive thinkers in England, France, and later in Germany began to assail the absolutism of the state and the orthodoxy of the Church; in Germany the line led from Leibniz, Thomasius, and Wolff to Lessing and Kant, and eventually to the rise of an educated upper middle class. Literary developments encompassed the emergence of a national theater, literature, and a common literary language. This became possible in part because of advances in literacy and education, especially among bourgeois women, and the reorganization of book production and the book market. This major new reference work provides a fresh look at the major literary figures, works, and cultural developments from around 1700 up to the late Enlightenment. They trace the 18th-century literary revival in German-speaking countries: from occasional and learned literature under the influence of French Neoclassicism to the establishment of a new German drama, religious epic and secular poetry, and the sentimentalist novel of self-fashioning. The volume includes the new, stimulating works of women, a chapter on music and literature, chapters on literary developments in Switzerland and in Austria, and a chapter on reactions to the Enlightenment from the 19th century to the present. The recent revaluing of cultural and social phenomena affecting literary texts informs the presentations in the individual chapters and allows for the inclusion of hitherto neglected but important texts such as essays, travelogues, philosophical texts, and letters. Though the hypothesis is refuted it still remains important, the chapters argue, because it charts out an entire research program, serves as a benchmark of definite public and private sector boundaries, and defines the grammar of discourse for constitutional economic policy in OECD states. These themes are explored in detail through contributions by economists,

philosophers, and social historians. The contributors examine utopias hitherto never or rarely reviewed in the English language, making this book of interest to students and scholars in economics, political science and the history of economic thought.
