Out of a range of subjects starting in the room itself (carpet, glass table, air, pen, books, therapy) and then moving from the room to the world at large (mountain biking, family, lawn, desert, river, fence) and further into the metaphysical (true identity, broken heart, unknown, death, living), comes a true illustration of the amazing statement by author Isaac Bashevis Singer: "The poet tried to solve the riddle of time and change, to find an answer to suffering, to reveal love in the very abyss of cruelty and injustice."

This book endorses Coleridge's statement: "nothing can permanently please which does not contain in itself the reason why it is so". It conceives 'Kubla Khan' as of a hypnotic poem, in which the "obtrusive

rhythms" produce a hypnotic, emotionally heightened response, giving false security to the "Platonic Censor", so that our imagination is left free to explore higher levels of uncertainty. Critics intolerant of uncertainty tend to account for the poem's effect by extraneous background information. The book consists of three parts employing different research methods. Part One is speculative, and discusses three aspects of a complex aesthetic event: the verbal structure of 'Kubla Khan', validity in interpretation, and the influence of the critic's decision style on his critical decisions. The other two parts are empirical. Part Two explores reader response to gestalt qualities of rhyme patterns and hypnotic poems in perspective of decision style and professional training. Part Three submits four recordings of the poem by leading British actors to instrumental investigation.

"BUT WHAT DOES IT MEAN?" This is the question you will hear tossed around any high school English classroom when analyzing a piece of literature. And when I say "tossed around," I mean this question is always chucked at the teacher like a pound of raw meat in a desperate attempt to extort the answer, as if there is a single answer, as if there has to be one. I went to a poetry seminar once where we tried to define poetry. Actually, every poetry seminar or writing class I have ever attended started with an exercise where we tried to define poetry. Of course, the meaning of the exercise is to prove to us that we cannot define poetry, we can only experience it. However, at this particular workshop, we arrived at a sort of consensus, not a definition per se, but a description of poetry, a diagram that seemed to fit. "It's three quarters of a complete circle," said a thin boy from Boston as he drew the gentle cup-shape on the chalkboard. "That's how I think of poetry." I've found that diagram particularly apt for describing not only

poetry but all writing and all artistic expression. The essence of the "three-quarter circle" is the idea that the audience must be given room for interpretation, space to make that jump from one edge of the circle to the other in the way that is most meaningful to them. If the meaning of the piece is too obvious, the circle is complete and the audience cannot relate to it. If the meaning is too obscure, the circle more closely resembles an arc and the audience cannot reach that essential destination. Truly beautiful or compelling art strikes somewhere in between. Of course, all of this is terribly unhelpful if you are trying to analyze one of Shakespeare's sonnets in English class. The answer to the burning question is that there is no answer. There is no short pithy phrase that can encapsulate all that fits into that space in the circle. This collection emerged from the emerging voices of DC area teen writers and ranges from depicting failed relationships to world travel, grief to self-discovery, the painfully realistic to the utterly absurd. The truth is, however, that the real world is absurd. And while

"Poetry to Ponder" gives us the beauty of the written word in its narrative form, or as in sonnets, villanelles, free verse, and haikus. All of the original 113 poems delve into the unusual, the artful, the interesting, the humorous, the mundane, the spiritual, and the quirky, among others. The author rightly touts the poems,

"a diversification of subjects and styles; written to 'flow', and are generally easy to understand." The other wow-factor is the double arrangement of the two indexes, by page number and alphabetical as well. This feature comes in handy for those who are desiring to become authors, or those who might be studying this book. It has been used in some high school English classes for instruction, example, and entertainment. Rex's work is like an awakening of a great poetic mind that is so diversified in its thinking, that it can connect with many different people in a sincere and easy-to-understand way. He radiates an oneness of spirit, in that many are touched by his unique, original writings. Rex was inducted into "The World Congress of Poets" in 2004. Since that time six of his poems have won first place in their international contests. He is considered by many of that group to be their "Dean" of poets.
